





Stewardship Prayer

Father in heaven, transform our hearts and reawaken in us the blessed hope that your Son secured for us on the cross.

Jesus, direct our path and help us to steward our time, talent, and treasure so that our lives may be beacons of your redeeming light to the world.

Holy Spirit, help us to recognize the gifts you entrust to us. Inspire us with generous hearts to cooperate with your grace as we pursue the pilgrim path toward your glorious kingdom.





"And hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." — Romans 5:5

"Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1817).

Hope summarizes the deepest longing and disposition of a disciple's heart. It is not something we naturally possess or acquire on our own — rather, it is gifted to us by the grace of God. Through our pursuit of God, we begin to cultivate this virtue. Ultimately, through the practice of stewardship — recognizing everything as a gift from God and using those gifts for His Kingdom — we become more open to hope. As stewards striving for eternal life, we surrender all that we have to God, trusting that the grace of the Holy Spirit surpasses even our noblest efforts. With the virtue of hope, we do not grow weary, for we recognize that God hears even our smallest prayers. This is why we, as faithful stewards, are called to be beacons of hope to the world.

God has gifted us with time. How we spend our time reflects our love and gratitude to our Heavenly Father. Do we use it to cultivate our relationship with Him and our loved ones? Prayer is a primary way to deepen our relationship with God. It strengthens and nourishes the life of a disciple.

In this Jubilee Year of Hope, the Church invites us to be pilgrims of hope who renew our faith in the promises of God and live joyfully in anticipation of their fulfillment. Do we trust in God's plan for us? Do we reflect on the good things He has promised? Through prayer, we open our lives to the voice of God and discover His unending love for us.

Consider these ideas to deepen your prayer life:

- Reflect on your current prayer habits. How can you increase the time you spend with God? How can you incorporate prayer into your family life?
- Meditate on God's promises of grace in your life. Ask for the ability to recognize His mercy and live joyfully in accordance with His promises.
- Pray for the virtue of hope and the grace to share this hope with others.

STEWARDSHIP OF Talent

As pilgrims of hope, we are called to spread the Good News and inspire hope in others, especially those experiencing hardship. Stewardship reminds us that God has given each of us unique talents to be used for His glory and the good of others. Out of gratitude to God, we are invited to share our talents to build His Kingdom. Are you using your gifts to serve the Lord? How is God calling you to serve Him today?

Consider taking these steps to share the gifts and talents God has given you:

- Reflect on how your talents can be used to build up God's Kingdom.
- Review our parish's Ministry Catalog and consider joining a new ministry.
- If you are already involved in a ministry, think about ways to grow in your role and strengthen your ministry's impact.

Just as time and talent are gifts from God, so too are material possessions — our treasure. Stewardship invites us to surrender all that we have to God's plan, including our financial resources. When we trustingly offer our treasure to God, we experience the freedom, joy, and hope that come from relying on Him.

Reflect on the following steps to express gratitude for the treasure God has gifted you:

- Our parish invites families to give 10% of their gross income to God: a portion to the offertory, another to the diocese, and the rest to other worthy causes, following the biblical tithe.
- To meet this goal, we must also manage the remaining 90% wisely. By setting goals, creating a budget, and understanding how generosity deepens our faith, we can exercise good stewardship of our treasure.
- Pray for wisdom and discernment in managing your finances and offering your treasure to God.


